

CLIENT PREPARATIONS FOR BED BUG SERVICES

In order for our company to provide the most effective service, we ask that you make a few simple preparations before we arrive. Proper preparation will be rewarded with faster and more effective treatment results. If any cooperation above and beyond what is listed here is required for your treatment, we will be sure to communicate additional items.

The following preparations are crucial to the success of the program and MUST be completed prior to our arrival. If items are not completed, service will be delayed.

- Remove all sheets, covers, dust ruffles, comforters, pillows, or any other bedding covers from your mattress and box spring in all bedrooms. Wash all bed linens in the hottest water possible and then run through a hot dryer cycle for a minimum of 40 minutes. After drying, place in a large garbage bag sealed at the top until the treatment has been completed.
- All clothes, on floors, hanging over chairs, or in built-in bed storage should be picked up, removed and laundered as above. Follow clothing label instructions for fabrics that cannot be washed in hot water to prevent shrinking or damage. These articles can be placed in a dryer on high heat only, then sealed in bags.
- Pumps and filters on any fish tanks or terrariums must be turned off. Top of tank must be sealed with 'saran' type of plastic wrap.
- De-clutter. This will assist in removing potential bed bug harborages. Check items for signs of infestation.
 Cardboard is a favored harborage for bed bugs, dispose of any unwanted packaging materials to remove these harborage sites from your home.
- □ When discarding or throwing out any infested items, please make them undesirable to other people to discourage and prevent the spread of bed bugs. Cut mattresses, tape a sign to furniture items stating it has bed bugs, use tape to mark items with an "X", etc.
- Do not re-arrange furniture other than moving items three feet away from the walls. It is not necessary to remove clean clothing items from drawers or cupboards unless these items are clearly heavily infested with visible bed bugs.
- □ Keep beds pulled out from the wall until bed bugs have been eradicated. All other furniture items can be returned to their original position after treatment.
- □ Vacuum baseboards to remove dust build-up from these areas. Remove the vacuum cleaner bag or contents of the canister, place in a plastic bag, and dispose of in the trash can outside your apartment/home.

□ All occupants, cats, dogs, birds, and other caged pets must leave the premise for four (4) hours.

- In order to give the treatment time to work, do not clean or remove the product barriers that have been applied. In most cases, barriers will have been applied in areas that are not normally accessed, but if an infestation was suspected behind baseboards or electrical outlets, for example, a 2" product barrier will have been applied on the wall above or around these installations, respectively. Under certain lighting conditions, these barriers may be visible. Leave these in place until you are certain that the infestation has been eradicated. The barrier will remain active for up to 3 months if left undisturbed, but can be easily removed with detergent and water, or disposable disinfectant wipes when required.
- □ Please allow 3 to 4 weeks after the treatment for it to be completely effective. Bed bugs may not leave their harborages for a number of days after treatment, and nymphs hatching from eggs will not be affected until they cross a product barrier.
